



Chapter 6 – Recommended Actions

- 43 Actions
- Categorized into 4 types:
 - Policies
 - Visioning/Planning
 - Stewardship
 - Implementation
- Table 6-1: at-a-glance summary of watershed objectives met and potential partners

Chapter 6 – Recommended Actions

The Actions satisfy one or more of the six watershed protection objectives (or provide these services):

- Flood Control
- Water Quality
- Habitat
- Ecosystem Processes
- Recreation
- Stewardship

Chapter 6 – Recommended Actions

- Guiding Principles for selecting actions:
 - The creek, tributaries and watershed are community assets that provide basic services
 - Actions are consistent with existing regulations, policies, plans
 - There are willing participants to implement the actions
 - Private property rights are respected

Chapter 6 – Policy-Related Actions

- Action 42 Recommends amendments to existing local policies, codes, standards to integrate watershed protection
- Various other actions Recommend consideration of policies in this Plan for specific future projects, for example:
 - 1 Cordova Hills
 - 2 Sun Creek
 - 13 Carmencita Avenue
 - 17 Elk Grove Rural Block
 - 27 Lower Laguna Creek (near Lewis Stein Bridge)

Chapter 6 – Policy-Related Actions

- Action 42 Five areas of interest:
 - Protect open space and stream/riparian buffers
 - Promote sustainable growth that integrates preservation of the creek corridor
 - Manage stormwater to mimic pre-developed conditions (e.g., low impact development)
 - Promote water use efficiency and groundwater recharge
 - Promote increased human connection to the creek resources

Chapter 6 – Planning Actions

Examples:

- Develop subwatershed plans for Elk Grove,
 Whitehouse, Toad and Sheldon Creeks
- Participate in visioning/planning for certain areas, for example:
 - 9 work with Spiva Rd. neighbors
 - 26 work with City of EG on Laguna Bypass extension alternatives
- Develop strategic plans for invasive weed removal (32), tree planting (33) and beaver management (38) in the watershed

Chapter 6 – Stewardship Actions

Examples:

- Work with landowners and developers on trails and interpretive signage: Bradshaw Christian (15), Jack Hill Park (21), Bufferlands (30)
- Continue successful Stewards and Creek
 Walk programs (35, 36)
- Look for grant opportunities to construct River Friendly demonstration gardens (40)
- Promote water use efficiency education projects (41)

Chapter 6 – Implementation Actions

Examples:

- Arboretum stream restoration (3)
- Waegell ranch reach restoration (5)
- Vineyard area storm drain daylighting (11)
- Jordan Ranch swale retrofits (16)
- Lower Camden Lake weir (23)
- East Lawn Cemetery connected trails (24)

Action 4 – Vulcan Triangle

Recommendation:

Work collaboratively with Sacramento County, ULCC and upper watershed landowners to provide community input to ongoing environmental study and explore alternatives for drainage and flood management in this area

Action 39 – Water Quality Monitoring Plan

- Continued monitoring is needed to document conditions, identify trends and evaluate effectiveness of actions
- Draft watershed-wide monitoring plan (Appendix G) needs to be reviewed and finalized

Next Steps

- Agencies are asked to support/endorse the Watershed Plan
- LCWC Board has prioritized actions and will be preparing an implementation work plan
- Other agencies could do the same for actions in their jurisdiction
- Solicit funding (upcoming Prop 84 grants, foundations, business community, etc.)
